Abnormal Uterine Bleeding (AUB) is a common condition defined as uterine bleeding outside the normal volume, duration, regularity or frequency.

Common does not mean normal.



AUB is more than just heavy periods. Women who experience AUB have many other symptoms that significantly impact their personal and professional lives.



Symptoms of Abnormal Uterine Bleeding vary based on the cause and can include



Heavy periods



Pressure on bowels & bladder



Unpredictable bleeding



Infertility

- Periods lasting longer than 7 days
- Soaking pads & tampons quickly
- Passing large clots
- Cramps
- Bloating
- Pain during sex
- Fatigue
- Mood Changes



Common causes of AUB include



walls or outside the uterus. Fibroids are Fibroids almost always benign



Polyps

Endometrial cells that cluster and grow in the uterine cavity. Polyps can become cancerous.

Dense tissue growths that can develop inside the uterine cavity, uterine

(not cancerous).



endometrium

Irregularities in hormone levels can lead to endometrial tissue that is thicker than normal, resulting in a heavy and long period, often with large blood clots.
