


Treatments for Uterine Polyps



What are polyps?

Uterine polyps are composed of endometrial cells and grow on the lining of the uterine cavity. Polyps may become cancerous.



Signs and Symptoms of Polyps







- Frequent, unpredictable periods
- Irregular spotting or heavy menstrual bleeding
- Bleeding between menstrual periods
- Bleeding during or after sex
- · Bleeding after menopause
- Infertility

Diagnosis

- Pelvic Exam
- Ultrasound
- Hysteroscopy
- Endometrial biopsy



Polyps can be as small as a sesame seed or larger than a golf-ball, however, symptoms are not always dependent on the size of a polyp¹.

Treatment

- Complete removal of the polyp and further testing of the tissue
- Watchful waiting for low-risk, pre-menopausal patients
